NOTE FROM NEPAL

Dear Ones.

The last few days have been spent in praying, talking, and trying to reconcile people and groups of people that have been estranged for years. Last Sabbath 2 prominent women in the church here in Nepal were able to weep and reconcile their differences. Since these 2 ladies are strong leader types, Elizabeth was able to begin to share her dream with them (and other Nepali ladies) her goals for Women's Ministry.

There are some "independent" SDA churches in Nepal. The Lord has arranged for us to meet with the SDA personal from the US concerning this problem. They desire that we work with them. We met with a "pastor" of some of these "independent" churches and ironed out some differences. Our Nepal Field president, Pastor Tamsang with the pastor of this area also met with these folks. We explained that a church is not just a building. We also explained that there is a process for a "fellowship" to follow so that they can become an organized Seventh-day Adventist Church. We pledged pastoral support for these fellowships in the form of pastors to do baptisms, communions, weddings, etc. The trouble is people from the US send money to Nepal to build churches. Great, but then someone needs to nurture and develop the interests into a living church family structure.

February 23-25 is a Gospel Outreach workers convention that we are lookng forward to.

March 5-11 there is a Church Leadership Training Program sponsored by Laymen's Ministry with a speaker Jan Ross from Amazing Facts. This will be a great blessing to Nepal.

March 8 we hope to move into our house in Kathmandu. We still do not have a visa-but have been told we should not have trouble getting one-either a student visa studying Nepali or a work visa.

March 13-17 is the Literacy Training Program in the far Eastern section of Nepal.

This evening we are having dinner with the Christian Association of this district. Other Christian groups avoid SDAs like the plague-thinking that we are a cult. We pray that we can show them that we are not. Thank you Brookings and Gold Beach for giving us the chance to feel comfortable with other Christian denominations. Love, Charles & Elizabeth Shultz
